### 1. SAFE AND CARING SCHOOL ENVIRONMENT:

## 2. ACCESS TO A BROAD PROGRAM OF STUDIES:

- Support split grades for Math and Language Arts, when logistically possible.
- Junior High Students have access to a multitude of CTF
  Options, including: Arts & Crafts, CTF Trailers
  (Construction, Cosmetology, Electrical, Small Engines),
  Cooking, Drama, Music, Active Living, Outdoor Education,
  Coding & Robotics
- Junior High Students have an opportunity to participate in Leadership Class where they build upon concepts such as; community, public speaking, presenting, charity work, donation work, yearbook creation, and school pride.
- Students have the opportunity to participate in virtual outside presentations such as; Farm Safety, Meet the Emergency Response Team, Telus World of Science, Author Visits, Musical Engagements, Magician Performances
- Students act as MC's for Remembrance Day Ceremony and the Christmas Concert.
- Students will utilize the Public Library and participate in presentations offered through the community Library

- Students have access to participate in extracurricular activities including, Intramurals. Volleyball, Basketball, Badminton, Track & Field, and Walk/Run Club
- Literacy Interventions offered. Lexia, Empower Reading, Code Constructors, Guided Reading, Jolly Phonics (K-4), and Individualized Reading Plans.
- Provide additional classroom supports where needed
- Use of Google Classroom, and Webpage dedicated to online learning by K-9 to ensure students have access to materials in the event they must isolate.
- Use of Key Math to support gaps in math knowledge
- EYE Screens in Kindergarten

# 4. STUDENT PREPARATION FOR LIFELONG LEARNING, WORLD OF WORK, CITIZENSHIP

- Junior High participate in EUREKA to develop conflict resolution and communication skills
- Develop digital technology skills through one-to-one device access for Grades 1 to 9.
- Grade 5/6 trip to Edmonton every two years to visit the Parliament Buildings and Visit the Telus World of Science.
- Offer Division 1 students field trip experiences to see the inner workings of local businesses (i.e. Bank, Fire Hall, Store)
- Provide students with learning experiences to enrich collaboration, critical thinking, verbal and written communication and cooperation.

# 5. LEVEL OF PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT IN CHILD'S EDUCATION:

- Monthly Parent Council Meetings occur monthly with a virtual platform offered. All parents are encouraged to attend.
- Local church organizations and local families provide weekly hot lunches for Junior High.
- Parents run a local booster club, in which our school benefits immensely.
- Parents and community members have taken on leadership roles in coaching, i.e. Walk/Run Club, Basketball & Badminton
- Parents are encouraged to attend school related functions and celebrations, which are offered throughout the year.
- Parents participate in fundraising opportunities for the Grade 5 and 6 trip and Grade 9 trip.
- Parent helpers are present in our Preschool Room on a rotation basis
- Parent volunteers are called upon when needed for events
- Teachers utilize apps/email updates in regards to student learning.
- Staff send out a newsletter at the beginning of each school year.
